

## **Post Doc Position Available**

The Department of Clinical Epidemiology at Aarhus University invites applications for one to three full-time positions as Post Docs Fellows. The selected candidates will contribute to and lead research centered on diabetes, obesity, and cardiometabolic diseases or pharmacoepidemiology funded by the Novo Nordisk Foundation and Aarhus University.

The focus and responsibilities for part of these positions will be to conduct advanced data analyses using the unique Danish population-based registries and electronic health records data to examine the prognosis of type 2 diabetes, obesity, cardiometabolic outcomes, or pharmacoepidemiology. The selected candidates will work with the principal investigators, other project faculty, and the rest of the research team to help achieve the project aims. They will help drive the research project forward from inception to publication while acquiring analytical skills and exploring new areas of investigation. The major responsibilities will include formulating scientific problems and statistical analysis plans, conducting data analyses, preparing conference abstracts and presentations, and manuscript writing/publishing. The publication of research results in high-quality journals and national and international conferences is expected.

There will be rich research opportunity to gain significant epidemiological research-related experience on cutting-edge topics.

### **Preferred Qualifications**

Previous research experience related to diabetes, obesity, cardiometabolic disease, or pharmacoepidemiology is desired but not required.

### **Requirements**

Applications are being sought from candidates who own a PhD in epidemiology, clinical medicine, biostatistics, public health, or related fields; as well as a record of publications in previous research areas. Candidates should have excellent written and oral communication skills, strong quantitative/analytical research skills, experience using SAS, STATA, or R for both data management and analysis, and the ability to work well independently and as part of a team with collaborators.

Initial appointments are for two years and renewal is based upon performance and availability of support.
